- Testified before the Arizona State Senate Public Safety Committee regarding law enforcement in Pima County and some proposed legislation

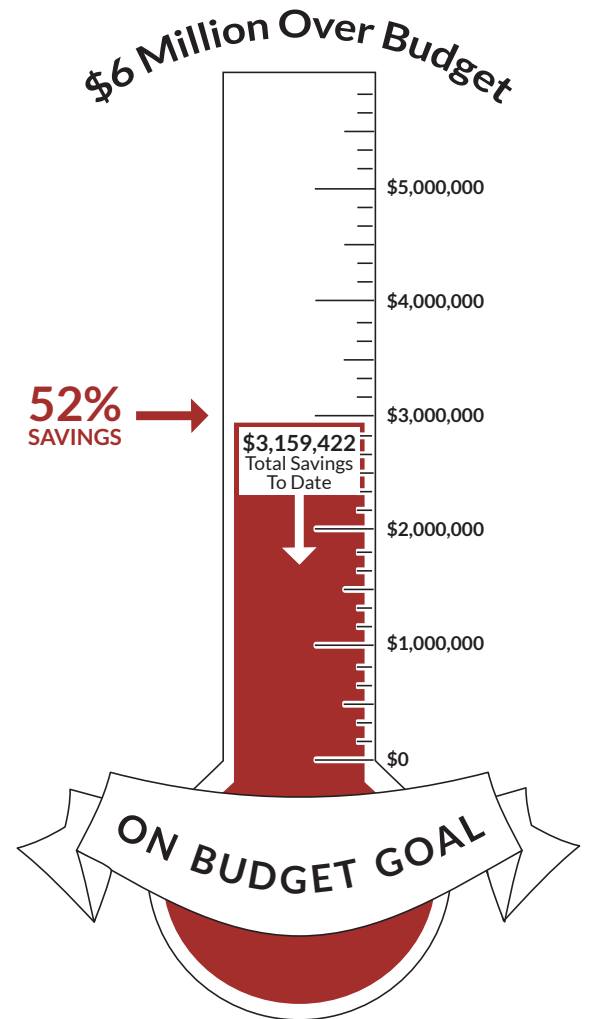


THE FIRST 60 DAYS: Department Spotlight

During his first 60 days, Sheriff Napier has made streamlining the budget a priority. Working with his department, he has been able to reduce the budget deficit by **52%** for a total savings of **\$3,159,422**.

While the majority of these savings were achieved during his first month in office, he was able to find and implement an additional savings of **\$562,532** during the past 30 days. These savings are shown below:

Overtime Management	\$204,000
Staff Reduction	\$210,344
Downsized Vehicle Fleet	\$38,750
Eliminated 2 Senior Manager Positions . . .	\$50,068
Cell Phone Service Reduction	\$59,400
